Heartlands Baby Sanctuary's primary goal is to give back every child in our care their "birthright to belong and to be reunited with a loving family".

Heartlands Baby Sanctuary is a temporary residential safe care facility for 25 children at any given time. We provide individual specialised care and support to children in desperate need of care and protection from birth to 6 years. Children are placed with a valid court order from the Children's Court.

After the Children's Court proceedings are finalised, they are either reunited with their parents or family members, placed in foster care, transferred to other long-term facilities or adopted. We strive to develop the family bond by either visiting or being accommodated in the mother's room. We educate them on how to nurture and safely care for their children, once reunited back at home. Heartlands Baby Sanctuary is a registered Child and Youth Care Centre and Community Mental Health Facility.

Chief Executive Officer's Report

As a society, we live in a world where only the famous or extraordinary make the headlines, when the truth is, the people who make the most difference, are ordinary people, quietly going about their lives, who genuinely care about what they are doing.

Throughout my 9-year journey as CEO and Founder of Heartlands, I have met many such people, who came forward helping Heartlands give abandoned, abused, neglected, malnourished and ill little children what they need most, a secure and happy home, love, comfort, support, food, clothes and a feeling of belonging. They have painted pictures to brighten up the walls, they've fixed cupboard doors, washed windows, planted seeds, rocked and comforted little babies. And, yes, donated money. The "unsung heroes" in our community, **I salute you all!**

I extend my profound gratitude, appreciation and recognition to each and every "unsung hero", who have in the past financial year, kept Heartlands turning. Your support is instrumental in bringing the vision of Heartlands to life. Your influence reaches far and wide, and together, we are making a significant impact on our beloved children, transforming their lives, changing their hearts, minds and souls, helping to mould their future... "one child at a time".

We kicked off the financial year with much enthusiasm in preparing for the new building for occupational and play therapy and indoor play area on the land next to the current play area, as we received confirmation from the Olivia Sieff Foundation's financial support towards the new building. Most of the next few months were spent on the drawings of the building, required approval process and preparing the area. The construction of the building was celebrated with a groundbreaking ceremony in Jan 2024 thanking Christine Sieff and Vanessa Wickens from the Olivia Sieff Foundation for their support and for making the development possible.



To further enhance our services, we received a multiyear financial grant from Allan Gray Philanthropy Initiatives to be used towards organisational strengthening activities, which include fundraising support, management processes, succession planning, and organisational costs. We started with implementing the succession and management structure with the appointment of Abegail Witbooi as the Sustainability Coordinator for the shop and Seeds of Hope Garden.

The new management structure for the residential section was implemented from the new financial year. I thank the employees of Allan Gray Philanthropy Initiative for nominating Heartlands as a beneficiary and for being the "unsung hero" of our success story.

This year we have also adjusted the structure of the volunteer programme to suit a variety of different needs and opportunities and therefore added to the programme a "Corporate Volunteer" component. We are very privileged and very excited to have been chosen as the beneficiary of the CSI Division at Capitec Bank Multi-year Social Investment & Capitec Volunteer Programme. 23 Capitec Insurance employees have

committed for 3 years of volunteering at Heartlands, either with the children or the Seeds of Hope Garden or both. Together with the volunteering, funding is provided to cover costs to complete specific projects.

The first event the Capitec volunteers were involved in, was the Festive Make-Over Initiative. The new outside staff area that was built for the staff still needed to get a final coat of paint on the inside and outside. This was done by the volunteers from Capitec in November 2023, together with funding to cover the cost of the staff furniture, in addition to some of the **volunteers** attending the children's Christmas party and covering some of the costs.



Further to the above they accepted to fund the completion of the infrastructure of the hydroponics as well as playing the main role in the “build/construction” of it and will see the project through until “reaping the benefits” stage has been achieved. Thank you to the “unsung heroes” of the CSI Division at Capitec Bank for nominating Heartlands and thank you to the Capitec volunteers for being an integral part of our organization. Thank you for continuing the journey with us, we appreciate your continued support and trust.

I would like to give recognition to another “unsung hero”, who selflessly and without an expectation of recognition has willingly come from behind the scenes to purchase a much-needed vehicle, giving some financial support towards the extension of the play area and also donated funding towards the organisation's running costs. Thank you for your kindness, your commitment and your unselfishness. **I salute you!**

I wish to thank the members of our board for their continued support and dedication. We appreciate the voluntary contribution which all our Board members make, thank you for being a Heartlands “unsung hero”. I would also like to applaud every member of the Heartlands team which of course includes our dedicated team of volunteers. Thank you for being a “hero” and for inspiring every child placed in our care to become “heroes” themselves. Thank you for being the “unsung hero” in a world full of sadness and heartache, who whispers hope into the hearts of our children who need it the most.

Aside from the continued support we receive from all the “unsung heroes”, we are also faced with the twists and turns of bigger and new challenges, like the state of affairs regarding the fire compliance and approved drawings of our facility. But we believe that with the backing and support of “unsung heroes” in our local community and abroad, we will find the inspiration and resources to meet each one of them.

As each and every “unsung heroes” commitment has been the cornerstone of our growth and successes in the past, we are excited to step into the new financial year, with the belief that,

But together we can start from now and make a brand-new end”*

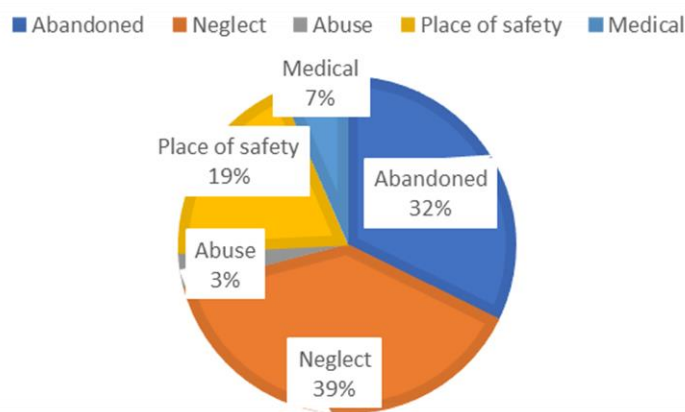


Child Care Services

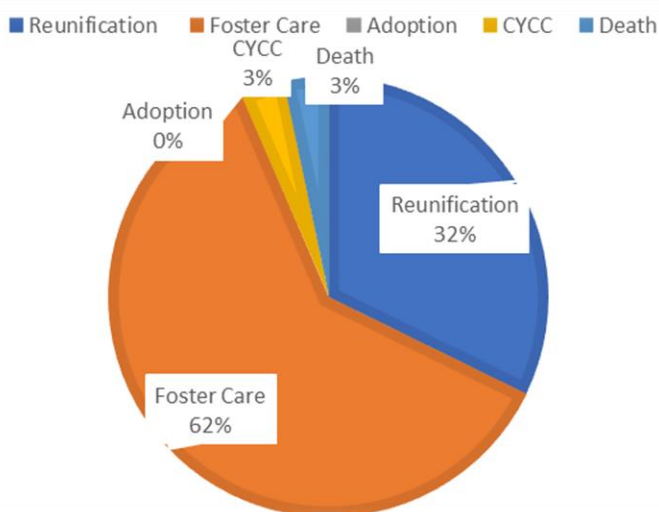
Psychosocial Programme

The psychosocial program of Heartlands Baby Sanctuary is a vital component of Heartlands services. This program involves admitting, orienting, providing therapeutic support to children, developing care and discharge plans, working with parents, recruiting foster or alternative placements, and facilitating discharges etc. This report will outline the highlights of the past financial year. It also includes images and acknowledges the unsung heroes who have contributed to the vision and mission of Heartlands.

The statistics indicate that neglect and abandonment are the highest factors leading to children being removed and placed in our care. Our unsung heroes here are the child protection social workers and police officers who work tirelessly to remove children from harmful situations. We also appreciate the hard work and decision-making of the magistrates at the various children's courts.



Additionally, children are placed in our care for reasons such as needing medical care and here we would like to give recognition and thanks to hospital social workers and doctors who refer cases requiring medical attention to Heartlands. Our volunteer doctor and therapists at Heartlands also play crucial roles in helping our children regain their happiness and health. We also thank the government medical facilities, Somerset West Clinic, and Helderberg Hospital for their assistance with the medical needs of our children



We are pleased that 32% of the children under our care were reunited with their parents or biological families, as it is important to us that families heal, and that cycles of abuse and neglect can be broken. While children are in our temporary safe care, we encourage parental and family visitation and contact as well as the option for mothers, foster mothers, or adoptive mothers to stay overnight at our facility. Over the past year, we have had a total of 225 visits and 31 mothers staying overnight at our facility to maintain contact and care with their children.



Additionally, 62% of our children were placed in foster care, and we are grateful for the support of foster parents and cluster foster homes who open their hearts and homes to provide care for children in need of alternative placements.

There are many more unsung heroes who contribute to the success of our mission and vision. However, from the psychosocial program, we express our gratitude to everyone involved. Thank you for taking the time to read about our successes and for your continued support.

At the beginning of each day, we all gather in the big nursery to give praise and thanks to God for the gift of a new day and finding His direction. What an awesome privilege!





The older children choose their own clothes for the day and they dress themselves, because they want to pick their own clothes and we want to encourage them to make their own choices, allowing them to build their own confidence.



Thank you to all our volunteers for being our “unsung heroes”. Thank you for being so helpful, especially when it comes to the individual attention that each child longs for and needs. They lovingly provide TLC to the small babies

The Body Stress Release is highly beneficial, as we see the children find ways of releasing build-up anger and frustrations. The male conductor is patient and does an outstanding task with the babies.



We have a special Emergency Room, which provides a room for the doctor and clinic staff to examine the children and assess their medical needs.

All the needed medical supplies are stored and kept in this room.

Developmental Programme

Every child who stays with us comes with their own unique story and their own set of challenges to overcome, while they are placed in our care. The saying that “it takes a village to raise a child” really resonates with us, because it takes a team of very special people, our “unsung heroes”, to turn each child’s story around into a good outcome.

To mention only a few children this year, it was the most beautiful little girl who came to us so underweight that she did not have the strength to stand on her own or the motivation to interact, form bonds or try new things. This little girl is still a very “fussy eater,” but she eats well now, she walks with good coordination, tries new things, explores with toys and most of all comes with a spontaneous personality and she definitely knows what she wants. It was the little baby boy born with Spina Bifida, whose prognosis did not look good in terms of mobility and cognitive development. Who is now leopard crawling all over, pulling himself up on his knees while problem solving with toys trying to find out cause and effect, against all odds. It was the precious girl experiencing severe trauma, anxiety, and low self-esteem who went through a period of daily emotional tantrums and meltdowns, to the point where she could hardly follow our daily programme or take much in during class. Thankfully, this girl seems to be over the worst, she has few meltdowns now, smiles and laughs more and more every day and starting to do well in class.

Our children’s lives are turned around because of the way our “unsung heroes” show love, dedication and passion to our children.



The ECD teachers provide well resources and structured play-based programmes that are adapted to children’s individual needs and also adapted to new children admitted and discharged



Our carers and volunteers who assist during play sessions and spend one-on-one time with children.



The special attention, interaction and the specialised exercises they help our children with. All the walks in the garden to help calm those children down during emotional days, makes a big positive difference.

Also, assisting with the school outings and making it so much fun, creating new positive experiences and memories for our little ones

Dog Therapy, Kiddies Yoga, Stimuzone (computers) and Monkeynastix. These activities broaden their experiences and combined help develop our children's creativity, body awareness, movement through senses, reduce stress, and help with self-confidence.

Volunteer Program

The volunteer program at Heartlands Baby Sanctuary has been successful over the years, offering opportunities for local, international, corporate, and community volunteers. Local Volunteers:



The local volunteer program allows local community members to dedicate 2 hours per week to volunteering. In the past year, we had 3 successful intakes, with a total of 75 individuals attending our intake sessions. The program has received great attendance and support from the community.

International Volunteers:

We were fortunate to host an international volunteer from Germany in the past year, who is a health and paediatric nurse. She volunteered in our childcare centre from May 2023 to August 2023, and she had formed strong bonds with the children and staff during her time with us.

Several Capitec staff members volunteered their time and underwent necessary training in January and February 2024 to engage with our programs. Over the past year, we had 40 community work students who came to do community work in different departments for community work hours or as part of a school project.

These students helped with activities such as housekeeping, working in our Seeds of Hope food garden, and sorting donations for our pre-loved shop.

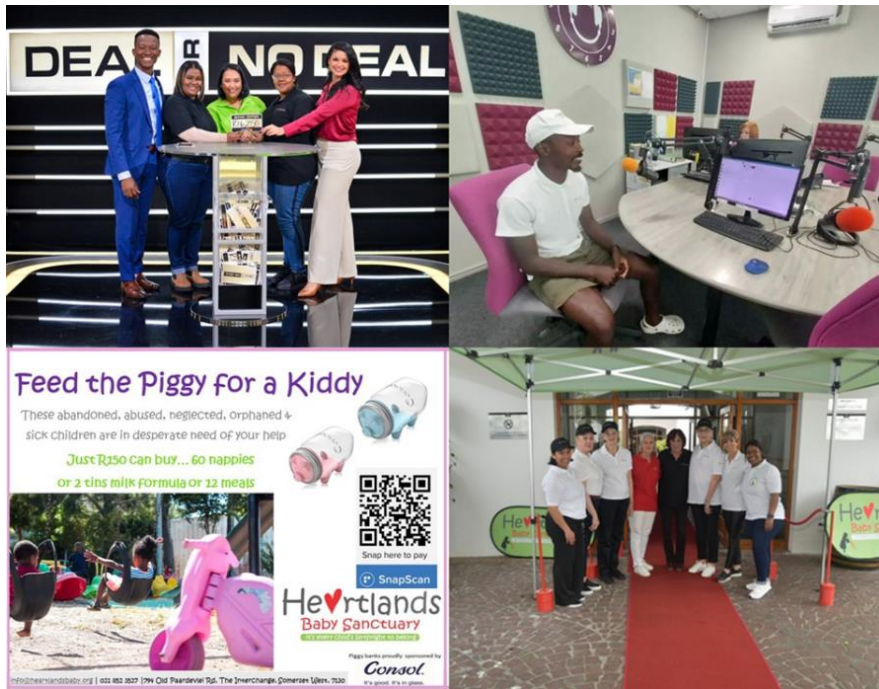

3 years ago, this land was not utilised and we reached out to City of Cape Town, where they approved our request to start farming on it, as our 3rd sustainability project.

From that time, we have worked the land, first following Farming God’s Way principles (FGW), and then later started bring in the latest technology in form of Hydroponics.

We have held community trainings (FGW) on Heartlands premises, and we have planted and harvested over 3 tons of produce since then.

With sincere thanks to all the donors, individuals, corporates and the community, not forgetting all the volunteers for being the “unsung heroes” and for helping to bring it to how the farm looks now.

These photos above represent the education, money, effort, time and skills it took to get where the garden is today. Let us call it the implementation phase

1. Trainers Training in KZN, attended by our Garden Manager.
2. Implementation of the information, and skills sharing of FGW methods (Compost making).
3. Application and plantation period. Normally 3x a year.
4. The 3rd phase of hydroponics, from designing to material sourcing, the structure was starting to take shape.

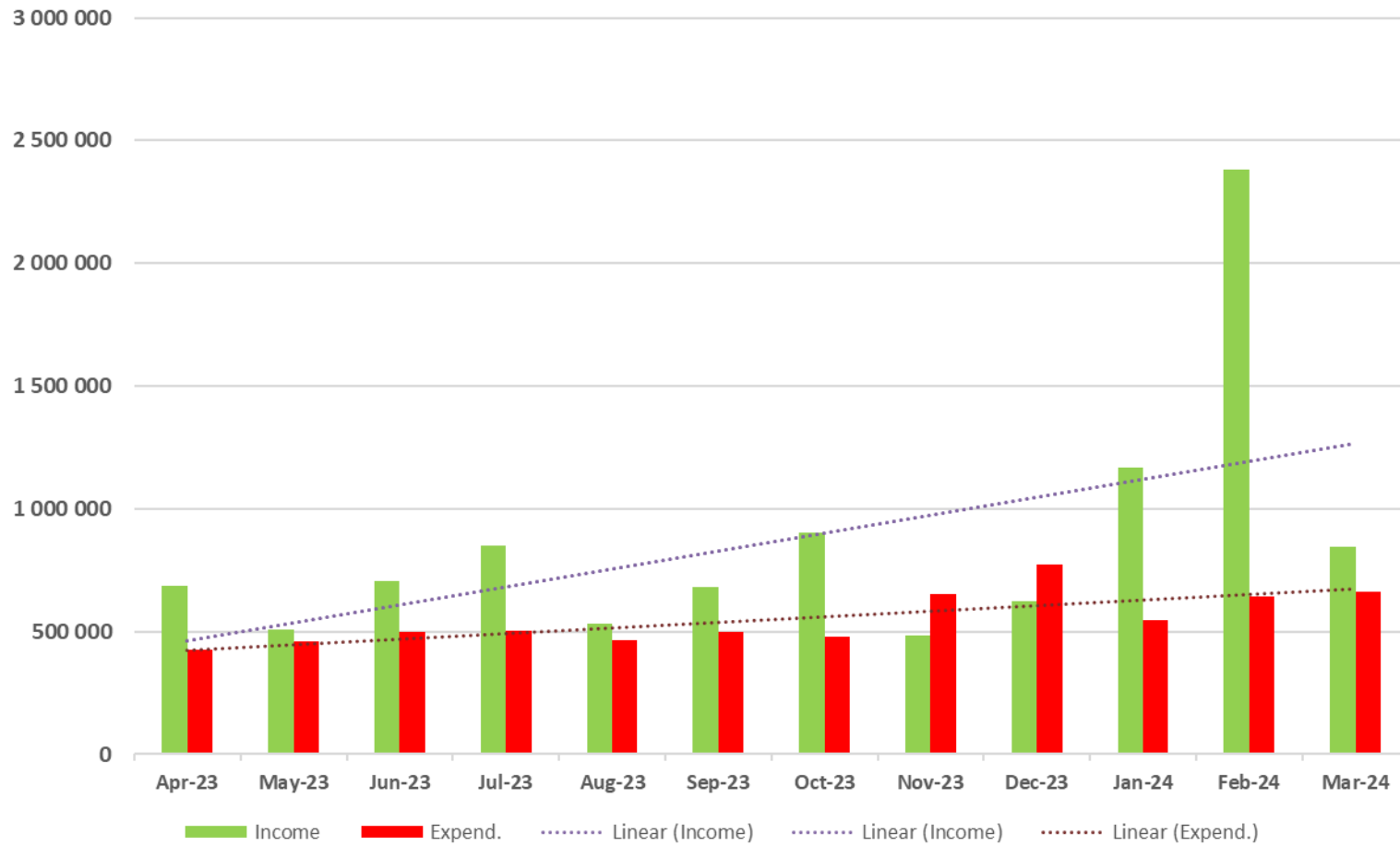

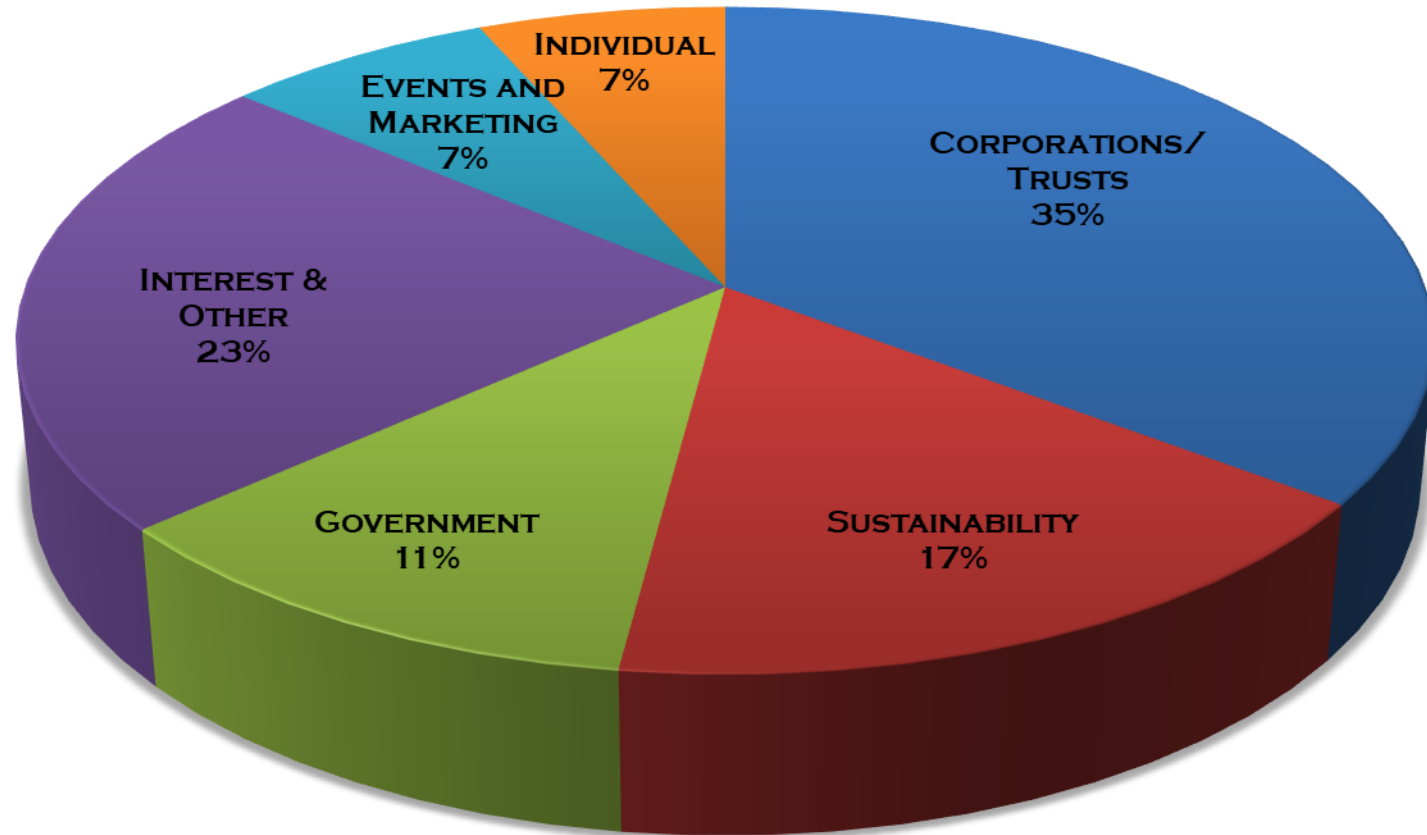

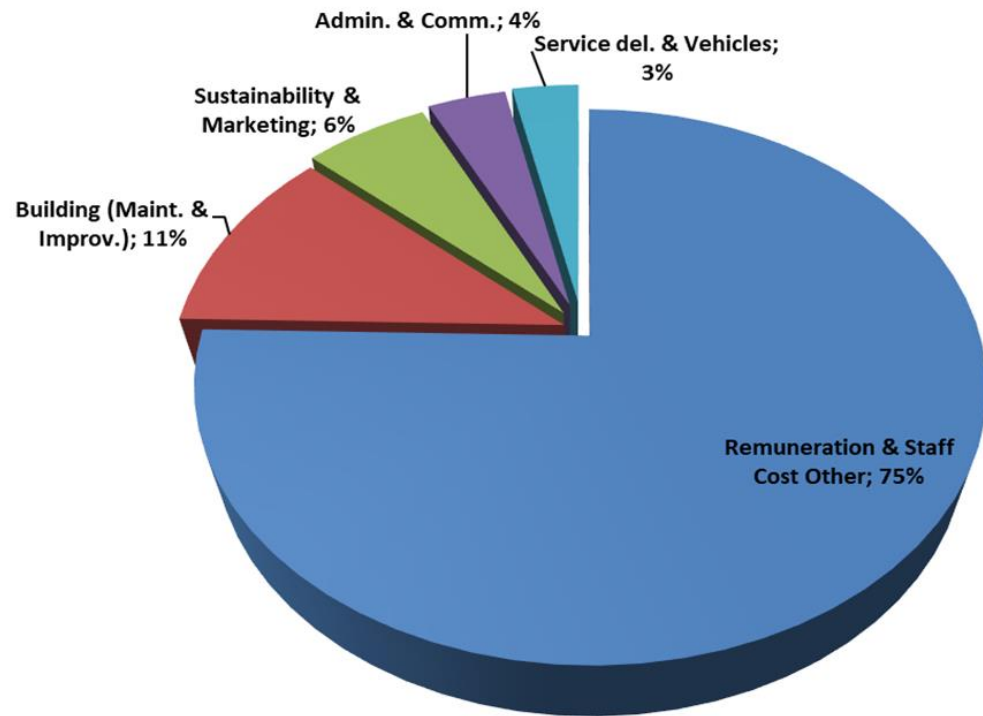
INCOME & EXPENDITURE BREAKDOWN PER MONTH

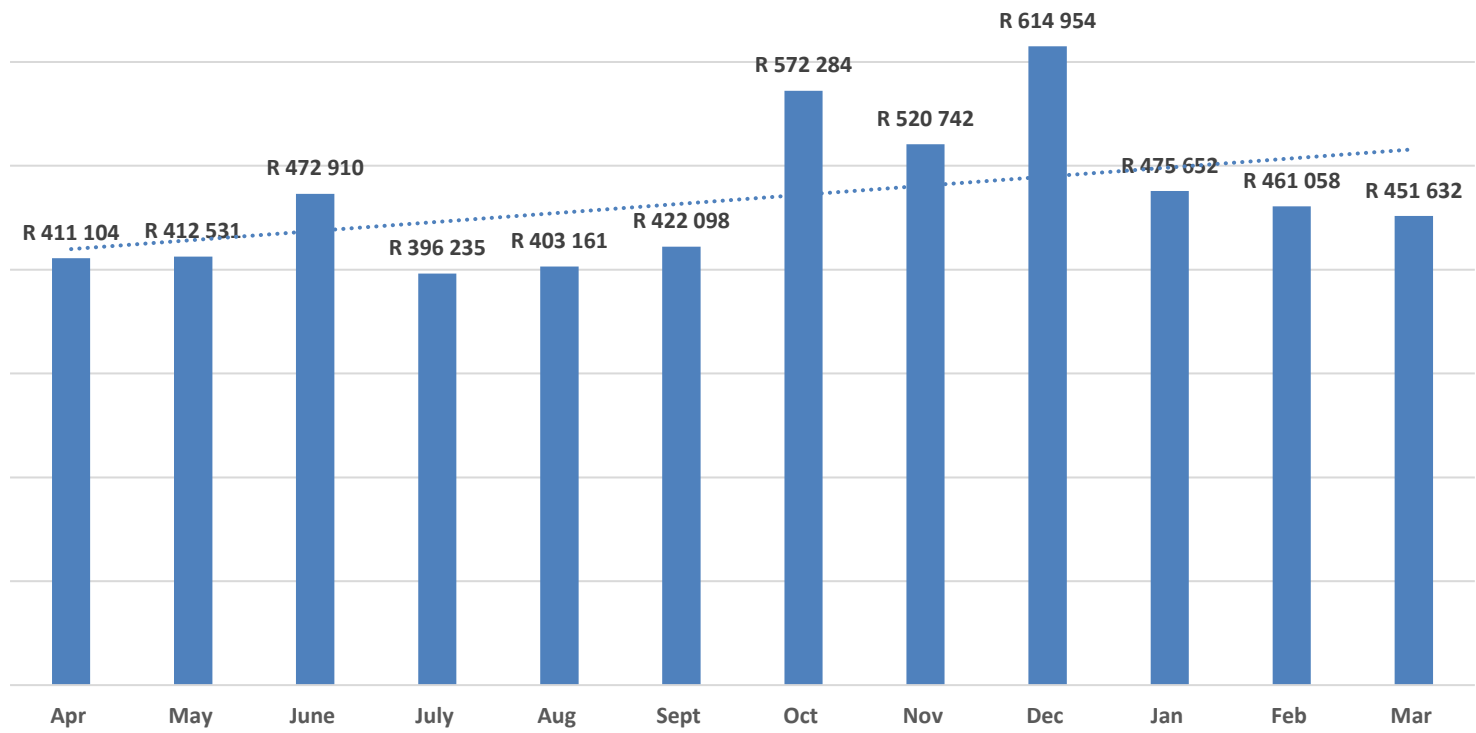


INCOME SPLIT BY SECTOR

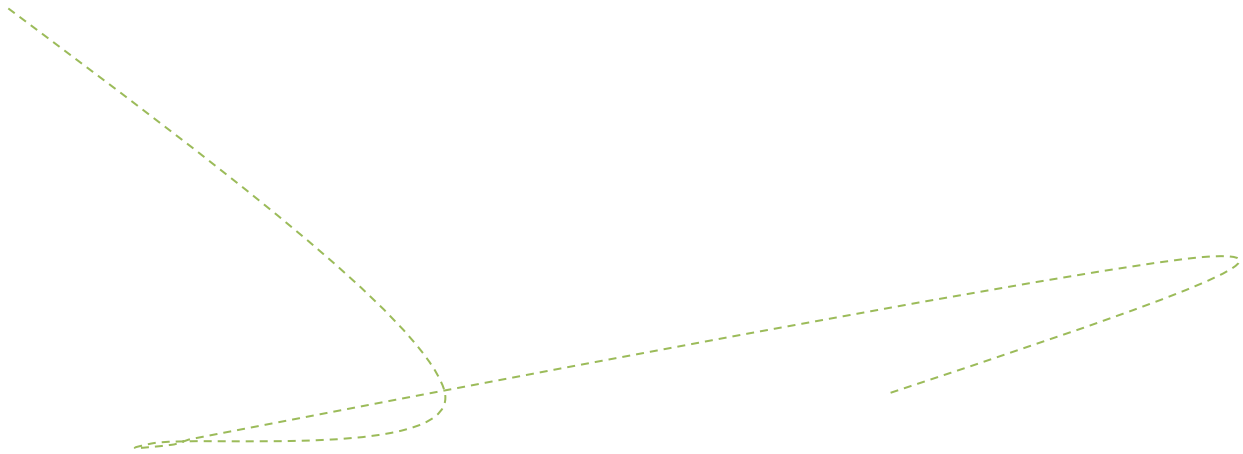
